

Open for Business – promoting tourism in the HS2 corridor

1 Feb – 31 July 2023 summary of activity

- A total of 58 businesses participated in the Open for Business programme during this period. Some were involved in multiple activities:
 - 9 businesses involved in the Chilterns Walking Festival May 2023
 - 19 businesses participated in networking events (March 2023)
 - 34 businesses featured in promotional campaigns
- There has been good engagement with the Experience tourism programme. A spring/summer 4 month digital media campaign helped to promote Experiences.
- The revitalised Chess Valley walk was launched on 27 May at an event in Chesham Moor. This was featured as part of the May 2023 Festival. Extensive promotion of the Chess Valley destination has taken place with a range of partners including Chiltern Railways. A new Chess Valley visitor guide is being produced and will be promoted from September.

Chilterns Walking Festival Summary

20 May – 4 June 2023

- The Festival featured **60 events over 15 days** (16 in the 5k corridor and a further 17 in wider Bucks)
- Guided walks took place throughout the Chilterns
- We worked with **over 32 organisations** and **volunteer walk leaders** across the Chilterns
- We had **517 participants on bookable walks** (179 in the 5k corridor and a further 153 in wider Bucks).
- The Chess Valley Walk launch event attracted around 200 visitors
- We had additional bookings on third party walks
- **63%** of respondents **visited at least one or more local business**

Chilterns Three Peaks

 Wednesday 24  9.15am  7.5 miles **Walk (3401)**

The Chilterns Three Peaks is a stunning circular route visiting some of the highest hills in the Chilterns. The walk takes in the wooded Pulpit Hill, Beacon Hill and Coombe Hill. It is a walk of spectacular variety through ancient natural box forests, quintessential quiet villages and far reaching views across Aylesbury Vale. We will visit Buckmoorend Farm Shop which stocks local produce and delicious teas and coffees. The walk is led by a local guide, with lots of insights!

Spring sounds, scents and sensations

 Thursday 1  10am  3 miles **Walk (3701)**

This sensory walk will give you a chance to not only enjoy the beautiful vistas of the Chilterns, but also bathe in some of the other sensory splendours that this time of year has to offer. Starting at the regular haunt of renowned war poet Rupert Brooke, The Pink and Lily pub, we will step into the sense-scape. We will pause regularly to appreciate the seasonal sounds scents and sensations, with poets on hand for a few pointers. The walk finishes at the Pink and Lily where those who wish, can pause for further reflection and refreshment.

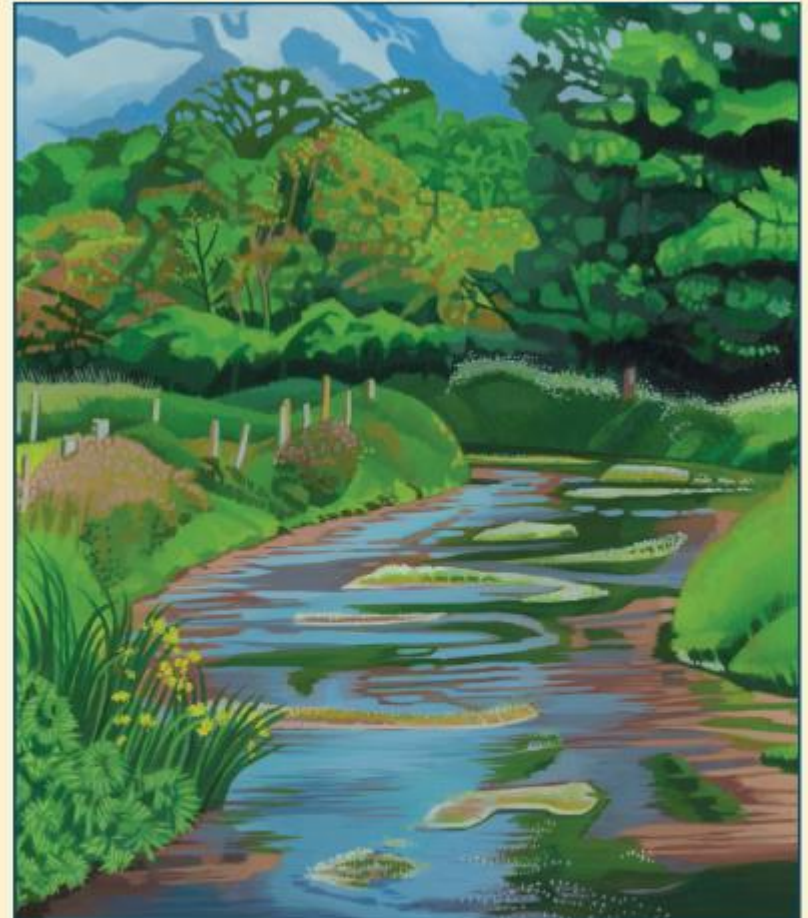

How to get here

The Chess Valley lies approximately 30 miles from London and is served by excellent rail links. London Underground Metropolitan Line trains run directly from Central London to Chesham. The average journey time from Baker Street is 50 minutes. Chiltern Railways mainline trains from Marylebone serve Rickmansworth, Chorleywood and Great Missenden, linking with the Chesham branch line at Chalfont and Latimer.

20 May - 4 June

- **Birdsong and wildflowers of spring 21 May:** Walk through a range of landscapes with interesting birds and wildflowers and lovely views, taking in the Hartlock Nature Reserve and the Thames Path. At the lunch stop at Path Hill Farm we'll light our own fire and brew a hot drink, learning how to catch a spark and make a flame

- **Sunrise & Sunset Walks:** Enjoy the dawn chorus with an early-morning Skylark Walk on 25 May or watch the sun setting over the beautiful Bradenham Valley on a Bradenham Woods Sunset Walk on 24 May

- **Fancy a challenge?** Why not join the historic 'Beating the Bounds' walk in Chesham on 20 May (a whopping 25 miles) for a symbolic centuries-old custom of walking the parish boundary. Or enjoy the ups and downs of the Chilterns Three Peaks on 24 May, a 7 mile route visiting 3 of the highest peaks in the Chilterns. Stunning views guaranteed!

- Author and founder of Pause Global Danielle North will be joining Walk Works on their **River & Woodland loop** from Shiplake on 26 May and will offer a guided meditation from her new book "Walking Meditations"

- Join the friendly Salaam Seekers (a Muslim Women's Outdoor Activities Group) for a **Mindful Maharani Meander** in Stoke Row on 25 May, and finish with a complimentary drink and cake in the local café

- **Half-term family walks,** including South Stoke River & Picnic walk on 2 June and nature-spotting activities

- There are lots of map reading and navigation courses to help you plan or lead your own walks, including a **Nav and Natter** (Navigation for Women, on several dates) and half-day practical map reading & walk planning sessions (also several dates) led by Stuart Fletcher

- We celebrate the **Chilterns chalk streams** and revitalisation of the Chess Valley Walk with a River Chess discovery day at Chessham Moor (lots of family friendly nature activities) and guided walks in the Chess Valley to see the Mayfly and explore the local heritage.

Local trail guide & sustainability champion Fred Newton invites us to join the Bradenham Woods two-hour Sunset Walk

Oppices of beautiful beeches sloping into gently rolling valleys, make Bradenham Woods a picture-perfect place to watch the sun set.

And that's the idea behind a dusk walk setting off from Saunderton Station, HP14 4HX, at 6pm on Wednesday, 24th May, for a walk with a stop at St Botolph's church for a cup of tea or hot chocolate.

Fred Newton, local trail runner and founder of Boondock Events who lives in Bradenham, says: "We shall explore a secret bunkers and Bronze Age earthworks as well as hearing about some of the history of the area."

Fred, who is a keen runner and custodian of two badly behaved dogs, organised his first event over 10 years ago, coordinating a small team to attempt the UK Three Peaks Challenge. "The support vehicle broke down and we got completely lost in the fog on Scafell Pike... it was brilliant" he says.

"This kick started a real passion of exploring and being active outside. The events got bigger, and have since organised expeditions, swim/run adventure races, road running races and trail races. Being active and outdoors really is 'it'. If anyone ever asks you what the

meaning of life is (spoiler alert, it's not 42), just open your front door and head to your nearest green space."

Boondock Events is a small outdoor events business based from the Chiltern Hills offering scenic trail races, challenging guided day hikes and outdoor experiences.

The friendly, welcoming and inclusive group are responsible and vocal advocates for the environment through actions not words. Features include cup-free & plastic-free races, medals made from sustainable materials and every single entry includes a tree planted.

This highlight is one of the events on offer as part of the 11th Chilterns Walking Festival from 20th May to 4th June.

This will feature a programme of more than 60 walks and events throughout the Chilterns, offering a chance to enjoy the splendour of the landscape at its springtime best.

Other highlights include the chance to enjoy the ups and downs of the Chilterns Three Peaks, a seven-mile route visiting three of the highest peaks in the Chilterns, with stunning views.

There's also a circular walk to explore Aston Rowant Nature Reserve with its panoramic views and wild flowers, on 25th May.

There are walks taking in nature reserves and the special landscapes and views of the Chilterns, led by knowledgeable guides. Find out about the management and conservation projects in these special places.
